) Terminating Commission Certification for the Beacon Solar Energy Project

On May 13, 2013, NextEra Energy Resources, L.L.C., filed a letter with the California Energy Commission requesting to terminate the Energy Commission certification for the Beacon Solar Energy Project.

The 250-megawatt project was licensed by the Energy Commission on August 25, 2010. The proposed project would have been located in Kern County approximately four (4) miles north-northwest of California City, on the edge of the Mojave Desert.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Energy Commission staff reviewed the letter and recommends approval of NextEra Energy's request to terminate the Energy Commission certification for the Beacon Solar Energy Project.

ENERGY COMMISSION FINDINGS

Based on staff's review and recommendation, the Energy Commission concludes that the requested certification termination will not result in any significant impacts to public health and safety, or to the environment.

CONCLUSION AND ORDER

The California Energy Commission hereby adopts staff's recommendations and grants the request of NextEra Energy to terminate the Commission certification, effective May 13, 2013.
