Either. I think it's a question of how much memory the exhibits will eat up. CD's take up to 750 MB and DVD's can contain much more than that.

BTW: I got a phone call from Samantha Pottenger yesterday asking if it was ok for Ormat to make an opening statement. I said it was ok, but to remember that an opening statement is not argument. It is merely an explanation of what the evidence will show. It is useful when the evidence is a complex web of information and the trier of fact needs to understand how all the threads will weave together to form something that will ultimately show their relevance. It seems to me that CURE might also want to prepare an opening statement if you wish. I just admonish that if you do, you stick to what the evidence proves and not get into argument. Opening statements shouldn't be more than a few minutes in length.
