The City of Manhattan Beach is concerned with the development of the El Segundo Power Redevelopment project and its impacts on our residents at the north end of our City, during construction as well as permanent operations. The City was an intervenor for many years when the redevelopment project was being reviewed by the CEC, starting more than a decade ago. Through ongoing meetings over several years and dialog with the neighbors, the Plant, the City of El Segundo, various agencies and the CEC, we helped to develop a set of Conditions of Certification that mitigated the impacts of the construction and on-going operation of the plant. The key areas of concern to the City and its' residents were, and continue to be, noise and aesthetics.

We have reviewed the complaint filed by Michelle Murphy and Bob Perkins on July 3, 2012. The City of Manhattan Beach feels that the construction at the Plant needs to conform to the original approved plans. The deviations currently constructed do not conform to the approved plans, or the intent of the project description, conditions and mitigation, and have significant visual impacts. Modifications should be made to conform to the approved plans, or make revisions subject to public review and input, in order to mitigate any negative impacts.
