Thank you for the opportunity to address the staff and the California Energy Commission with regards to the proposed building of two energy plants in northwest Hayward, near our beautiful shoreline.

The Board of Directors of CATS, Citizens for Alternative Transportation Solutions, on July 2, 2007, voted to oppose the creation and building of the original Russell City Energy Center (RCEC) Hayward, formerly known as the Calpine plant.

The Board of Directors also voted to oppose the creation of and building a second plant, a so-called feeder facility, called Russell City Energy Company, LLC. These names are referenced on page 3/5.

CATS, as an organization, has been in existence since 1985 and has paid close attention to transportation matters throughout the City of Hayward and its adjacent areas. CATS addresses the City of Hayward and other public and private agencies when necessary.


