Re: I am against the proposed Russell City and Eastshore Energy Centers

Dear Mr. Pfanner:

I have lived in Hayward for 40 years and currently live in Woodland Estates in the Hayward Hills. I am **against** the Russell City Energy Center and I am also **against** the Eastshore Energy Center. With these sites being on the eastern edge of the San Francisco Bay, wind should be a key consideration. Every day the prevailing winds come across the Bay, moving west to east and often with significant velocity.

Despite the latest in pollution control technology, the exhaust pipes will be emitting airborne toxins and particulates. The winds will carry the exhaust plumes directly over densely populated residential areas across Hayward and up to the equally populated hills where I live.

Despite the proposed sound-muffling plan, noise pollution generated by the very high horsepower engines at these power plants will also travel to the east, accentuated by the same wind conditions off the bay.

These power plants will reduce the quality of life in Hayward. Their exhaust will increase the already rampant number of asthma cases and other pollution-causing lung ailments. Economically the value of homes and businesses will decrease, which will reduce Hayward's revenue from transfer taxes and sales taxes.

The plans for the power plants are seriously flawed. For example, the proposed sites are in a zone where liquefaction is expected from an inevitable Bay Area earthquake. The sites are near the Bay, which has a fragile ecosystem.

I respectfully request that the California Energy Commission deny both the Russell City and the Eastshore Energy applications.
