

Dear Mr. Paul Kramer and the Energy Commission Mangement Team,

As a resident of the Hayward/Castro Valley Area, I can assure you no one wants the TierraEnergy Plant or any other Energy Plant here in Hayward or in the surrounding areas.

This Energy Plant would be surrounded by huge populated cities, Hayward, Fremont, Union City, San Leandro, San Lorenzo, Castro Valley, where home values starting at 500,000.00 exceeding 1 million is common place, the air quality is already a heated issue here in the Bay Area, ... have you ever drove on 880 during a weekday commute, behind about 5 big rigs, well, Mr. Pflanner, I suggest you do this daily for about a week through Hayward, and you'll get the picture of what I am talking about. Would the Tierra Eastshore Energy Plant be depositing 18.59 lbs. of Nitrogen Oxide, 29.42 lbs. of Carbon Monoxide, 32.32 lbs. of POC's, 3.31 lbs. of Sulfur Dioxide, and 30.8 lbs. of PM10 in our air for each hour of **operation ?**

These Plants would be near the wetlands, it would definetly effect the biological make up of our ecosystem. Where are your biological **studies?**

Also, Cal State Hayward, (Cal State East Bay) and Chabot College, with more than 30,000 students combined are both less than 15 miles from this proposed plant. How would that effect students, or attract students, who are currently doing everything they can for a greener earth. In all fairness are you having a meeting regarding this at Cal State **Hayward?** I know this wouldn't sit well with the students or facility there.

We already have all the Oil refineries in Emeryville and Richmond, and those people as you know are suffering in their Cities, along with poor bay water quality, (as you can NOT eat what you catch in that area, we don't want that to happen here.)
