Don't sacrifice our pristine desert Lucerne Valley, Juniper Flats south of Apple Valley, and up through Coyote Flats north of Coxey Meadows, the Granite Mountains between Apple Valley and Lucerne Valley, Fifteen Mile Valley, Old Woman Springs area, Johnson Valley, Homestead Valley, and Morongo Valley to bankrupt-prone, nature destroying, tax-payer subsidized industrial scale wind and solar farms, nor their destructive transmission towers.

These lands are the home and refuge of bighorn sheep, desert tortoise, brown eagle, bats, turkey vultures, mountain lions, black bears, kit foxes, Joshua trees, yucca plants, ancient creosote clone rings, ancient dry lakes, rugged and beautiful mountain ranges, sacred Indian sites, and home of us nature loving desert rats. We have sought refuge here from the scars of modern industrialization and over-development. We are here to protect this treasure for which we are stewards.

Land scarring industrial energy sites must not gain even a toe-hold here. Please come and tour this wonderland with us. Many times the energy, and at a fraction the cost, can be obtained by roof-top solar here, on government and private buildings, and especially in the cities where the bulk of power is needed. Please encourage the implementation of California AB 811 to facilitate low-cost energy efficiency loans on our homes and businesses.

We also oppose any additional electrical transmission towers through our valleys and mountains. There may be ugly areas where this inefficient and cost-prohibitive energy production may be welcome, but our areas are not among them.
