Re: Information regarding Romoland School District facilities and potential impacts from the proposed Sun Valley Energy Project

Dear Mr. Skumawitz:

Thank you for your letter of March 14, 2006. In the letter you identified a number of areas of potential concern to the School District, and, you provided detailed maps showing four elementary schools in the vicinity of the project. These areas of concern included pipeline routes, transmission line routes, use of hazardous materials and air emissions impacts. The letter and the maps have been distributed to technical staff that are analyzing these and related topics.

As part of our public review and permitting process a Data Response workshop was held in Perris, CA on April 25, 2006. This workshop was attended by yourself and Dwayne Mears of the Planning Center on behalf of the Romoland School District.

During the workshop information and discussion of the potential impacts of the Sun Valley Energy Project's (SVEP) construction and operation phases on the schools and children was shared.

The Energy Commission staff will perform an independent analysis of the proposed project and will develop recommended conditions of certification that mitigate potential impacts of the SVEP should it be approved. Information provided by the Romoland School District will be an important part of the analysis, and will assist in identifying the potential impacts of the construction and operation of the SVEP. Staff will assess a variety of health and safety factors including storage and transport of hazardous materials, equipment and materials delivery, work schedules for both construction and operation personnel, and traffic patterns associated with the construction and operation phases of the proposed project. Based upon our discussions at the workshop the following additional information from the School District would be very useful to the extent that it is available:


- Addresses and status (planned, operational) of each school
- Typical starting and ending times for student activities at each school
- Summer school locations, duration and schedules

- Potential (projected) trends in enrollment for the 2006-07 school year, and beyond
- Identification of potential sites for new elementary or secondary school development in the area
- Designated school crossing areas and crossing guard programs for each school
- Plans, if any, for school busing programs within the Romoland School District

This information would be useful as staff develops its analysis of the Sun Valley Energy Project and the associated conditions of certification that may be proposed to avoid or mitigate potential impacts of the project.
