SUBJECT: Historical information on Southeast Waste Water Treatment Plant (SEWWTP) and the abandoned outfall pipe in the route of the new SPERP process water intake pipe		
<p>Ms. Bastian asked Mr. Loiachono, how old the abandoned pipe was and when it was abandoned.</p> <p>Mr. Loiachono explained that the pipe was installed in 1966. It had run north from the SEWWTP under Islais Creek, up Third Street, east on Marin Street, and out Pier 80 to an outfall 800+ feet in the bay. It was abandoned in 1986 or 1987 because it had settled badly—4 ½ feet. A new outfall pipe was installed some 200 feet south of the old one, but connects to the old outfall at the end of Pier 80. The SEWWTP began operations in 1952, but discharged treated waste by gravity directly into Islais Creek until regulations required a deep water outfall sometime in the '60s. That is when the pipe under discussion was installed, along with a new pumping station.</p> <p>Ms. Bastian asked if the historical resource identified in the SFERP AFC as the "Islais Creek Treatment Plant" was the same thing as the SEWWTP.</p> <p>Mr. Loiachono thought that "Islais Creek Treatment Plant" was a misnomer and assured Ms. Bastian that there was only one treatment plant in the Islais Creek area.</p>
