Response to City of Carlsbad's Letter re SDG&E's RFO**

Dear Mr. Monasmith:

On or about, June 12, 2009, Mr. Joe Garuba, Municipal Projects Manager for the city of Carlsbad ("City"), sent a letter to George Piantka, Carlsbad Energy Center LLC's ("Applicant") Project Manager for the Carlsbad Energy Center Project ("CECP"). Therein, Mr. Garuba inquired about San Diego Gas & Electric's ("SDG&E") Request for Offers ("RFO") processes in relation to CECP. The City forwarded that letter to you on June 18, 2009. While the letter does not proclaim to be a "data request," it includes questions specific to CECP and has been docketed with the California Energy Commission ("CEC") and served on the parties to the CECP AFC proceeding. As such, Applicant is responding to the letter here.

The letter asks questions regarding SDG&E's RFO processes for new generation. Because these processes are confidential to ensure competitive and fair electricity pricing for ratepayers, Applicant cannot comment on this topic. Applicant's silence is not an issue within the context of the CECP application for certification proceeding as the Warren-Alquist Act does not require evaluation of, nor does the CEC attempt to evaluate, an applicant's plans for the marketing and sale of electricity beyond understanding what the operational characteristics will be for a project.


To that end, as Applicant has explained and continues to point out, CECP will provide much needed, fast-response, highly efficient, clean natural gas generation in the San Diego region, and that this generation will be an ideal back stop to increasing use of non-dispatchable renewable energy. Further, CECP will enable Units 1, 2 and 3 to be shutdown at Encina Power Station.

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
