**Re: Carlsbad Energy Center Project (07-AFC-6)
City's Status Report #4**

Dear Commissioners:

Pursuant to the Committee Scheduling Order dated December 26, 2008, the City of Carlsbad submits its City Status Report #4 for the Committee's consideration. This status report highlights the work to date on the proposed Carlsbad Energy Center Project (CECP), which is proposed by NRG (Applicant), and the ongoing concerns and objections the City has with the proposed power plant.

Project Ambiguity

Due to the lack of significant information, the proposed CECP and its potential impacts continues to be ambiguous. This lack of project specificity continues to create considerable uncertainty for the City and the community. Examples of areas that remain unclear, even at this stage in the project development:

- Site Layout
- Impacts to Interstate 5 and the LOSSAN corridor
- Emergency Response and Fire Protection Safety
- Air Quality, including Greenhouse Gas Emissions
- Water Supply
- Visual
- Noise

Interstate 5 Widening

Contrary to statements contained in the Applicant's Status Report #3, Caltrans has confirmed in their February 5, 2009 letter to the CEC, that their ability to move the freeway east is severely limited. The Caltrans letter highlights the long term preparation for this project (nearly 15 years) and reaffirmed concerns voiced by the City, for more than the past year, regarding the widening of I-5. Furthermore, Caltrans identified that any all possible I-5 widening scenarios necessitate the removal of the safety barrier and visual screening proposed for the CECP. Recognizing the negative impacts created by these projects, Caltrans has requested that the Applicant demonstrate



how they can construct the CECP without impacting the widening of both Interstate 5 and the LOSSAN rail corridor. To date, the Applicant has failed to provide such information. Obviously, this information is fundamental to the project and without it the CEC and others are precluded in their ability to accurately analyze the CECP and its impacts on the region.

Non-Participation by the California Coastal Commission

It remains the City's position that provisions of the Warren-Alquist Act require the participation of the Coastal Commission. The City continues to request that the CEC encourage the Coastal Commission to fulfill its legislative duty.

Schedule

Due to the overwhelming lack of critical information, the schedule for this project remains uncertain. The City understands the time sensitivity for moving the CECP forward for consideration; however the City respectfully suggests that it would be a disservice to those involved and the community-at-large to do so without a clear understanding of the project and its impacts. The City contends that the majority of the project delays are self-inflicted by the Applicant (ie. Applicant's failure to acknowledge the I-5 Project), and had they acted in a responsible manner, many of the issues challenging this project today could have been addressed in a timely manner.
