Dear Commissioners:

This letter is to express my support for the proposed Carlsbad Energy Center Project. The citizens and businesses of North San Diego County require quality and sustainable resources for a reliable and economical supply of electricity. The Carlsbad Energy Center fits that bill for providing energy.

It is clear that the proposed site is the ideal location for the smaller and more environmentally friendly Carlsbad Energy Center Project. Alternative sites do not seem to be feasible due to significant adverse environmental and community impacts as well as insufficient electrical transmission capacity.

In addition, the current power plant was there way before people started building homes in the surrounding area. They probably received a considerable discount when purchasing land or homes built nearby. Now they want to reap a huge profit if the plant is no longer there.

Carlsbad's only other suggestion is to move the proposed new power plant inland and close to Ocean Hills Country Club, an Active Over 55 Retirement Community consisting of 1363 homes and 2600+ Residents. Our quiet active lifestyle would be no longer, plus the soot and polluted air they complained about at the meeting Monday night at the Hilton Hotel would now blow in our direction. They don't care if we end up getting cancer, which was one of the complaints that night. We were here "first" and now those who bought their land and homes "after" the power plant was built, want to move it in our backyard where the breeze and polluted air coming from the Southwest would now blow on us. Not only the air but the noise would carry our way and be heard day and night and our property values would decline while their's would rise dramatically from the discounted price they paid.

Also enclosed are three maps (one of which shows two other alternate sites that Carlsbad "was" considering...the Kato property and Merkle Reservoir), a letter written by Palomar Airport Association and a page showing the 1500 foot Palomar Traffic Pattern Altitude in relation to the 1600 foot total height including the 500 foot site elevation, assumed 100 foot stack height and the SRA recommendation height to avoid above the source, <1000 feet. A power plant clearly does not belong on the Business Parkway sites that Carlsbad has recommended recently after backing away from the Kato property and Merkle Reservoir.

I urge your timely approval of the sustainable Carlsbad Energy Center proposal.




A = Carlsbad's Alternate Sites

Business Park Locations

- Average site elevations: 472 feet (500)
- Assumed stack height: 100 feet
- SRA recommendation: avoid <1000 feet above source
- Height to avoid:
 - $500+100+1000 = 1600$ feet
 - Palomar traffic pattern altitude: 1500 feet

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
Dear Commissioners:

As President of the Palomar Airport Association, I do not agree with the City of Carlsbad's suggestion that there are better alternatives to the proposed Carlsbad Energy Center site. I submit to you that most, if not all of the alternatives suggested by the city involve locations east of Palomar Airport and are within what has been identified as an airport safety zone.

The Commission's Final Staff Analysis concurs with this position stating that amongst other things, *"Evaluated alternative sites pose potentially unmitigable aviation safety concerns requiring further study, or have been determined to pose significant aviation safety impacts."*FSA, p6-23.
