

Subject: Cultural Resources Data Adequacy Worksheet for the Kings River
 Conservation District Community Power Project

I called Dorothy Torres to clarify whether my planned response to their two data adequacy requests for additional information was sufficient to meet the requirements for making the Application for Certification conform with their regulations.

The first issue concerned the maps of record search results (Maps 1-11 in Appendix A) from the Southern San Joaquin Valley Information Center. The original record search did not provide a legend and I agreed to make one to more accurately depict: 1) the limits of the record & literature search area; 2) the previous cultural resource survey coverage areas with report number references; 3) locations of previously known resources; and 4) the current project area. This new legend will also incorporate the previously submitted "Southern San Joaquin Valley Information Center Record Search Results Map Legend" for Figures 1-11, so that all that needs to be done is to replace this sheet with the one previously submitted in Appendix A. She mentioned that would be helpful as it was difficult to decipher some of the record search data.

The second issue concerned the 1:24,000 scale, USGS maps depicting the locations of all previously known and newly identified resources in the project area. I informed Dorothy that this was provided in the report (Figures 2-7), which also depicted the current survey coverage in the project area. She mentioned that it would be nice to distinguish between the previously known resources (which were updated) and the newly identified resources. I said that I would keep the original maps in the report as is, but would generate a new version of the maps which will distinguish between the previously known (and updated resources) and the newly identified resources. I will also distinguish between the recorded resources and the noted finds (which included resources beyond the project corridor, but near the project area, as well as active railroads and bridges). I said that I will include these new maps along with the summary tables (Tables 2 & 3 in the report) at the front of Appendix C (the primary records for the newly identified resources and updates for the previously known resources in the project area), that way the report will remain unchanged and all we would need to do is insert these new Figures and Tables at the front of Appendix C. She felt that would be sufficient and thanked me for calling.
