

**CANYON POWER PLANT
STATUS REPORT #1**

Southern California Public Power Authority (SCPPA) submits this Status Report Number 1 to update the Committee on the progress related to the processing of its Canyon Power Plant.

In response to the July 29, 2008, decision issued on a suit brought by the Natural Resources Defense Council (NRDC) against the South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD), SCPPA submitted a Revised Permit to Construct/ Permit to Operate for the Canyon Power Plant on September 11, 2008. The revised application modified the proposed operating hours of the Canyon Power Plant from 4,006 normal operating hours to 2,408.¹ By reducing the projects permitted operating hours the project would no longer be required to access priority reserve credits under the former 1309.1 rule, but would instead qualify for an offset exemption under the current SCAQMD rule 1304. The project's Preliminary Determination of Compliance (PDOC) should reflect the proposed air quality analysis and is expected within the next few weeks.
