SUBJECT:	Data Requests and pre-filing conversations		

Conference call to bring me up to date on previous discussions they had with CEC staff (during pre-filing) regarding the project and how those discussions pertain to the data requests. There are several technical areas that were discussed in the previous meetings with CEC staff and the air district (BAAQMD). They will answer the data requests to the best of their ability, but there are some that they don't think are necessary and/or are requesting too much detail for what the project actually covers. They do realized that there are still many questions about the boundaries of the project related to the overall renewal project and that some staff may misunderstand certain aspects of it. They are looking forward to the data response work shop so we can hash out any controversy.

1. Air Quality comments - Dave stated that there was an understanding in the pre-filing meetings that the City's EIR and information from the Air District would be relied upon for our analysis. However, since Brewster was not involved in these meetings, he is not privy to what was discussed (I believe he said Eileen and Joe Loyer were involved in the Air District discussions), at least that I'm aware of. Dave also stated that it was agreed that there would be a single set of conditions characterizing impacts from project itself and relying on EIR for overall Renewal impacts. Brewster is targeting additional impact analyses that were covered in pre-filing discussions.

2. Public Health comments - BAAQMD is completing a Health Risk Assessment (with regards to air quality) and is currently working on a second one. Alvin is requesting that a HRA be performed on construction vehicle diesel emissions. Dave stated that historically they have not been asked by the CEC to perform a HRA.

3. Cultural Resources comments - Per Dave there is a misunderstanding about the nature of project connections. There is not going to be an expansion to Sub 5 and there is currently no containers on the site. They were all removed 2-3 years ago. Beverly also has a question about the piperacks, but the piperacks are components of the H2 Plant, not the PPRP. The H2 Plant could run without the STG. Cable is being layed on the piperacks because the piperacks are there; if they weren't, the cable would set in some other way.




4. HazMat - Dave says that there was a discussion with Roger regarding NH3 and how common it is in the refinery. There is already a lot of existing piping carrying NH3. The PPRP will add a few hundred feet of new piping for NH3 but there will be no additional NH3. The refinery operates under a risk management plan that addresses off-site consequences.

5. Visual - Steam Plume formation. There is no objection to staff doing a Plume analysis. However, many visible steam plumes already exist at the refinery. The cooling tower for the H2 Plant is much smaller than many of the existing ones.

There were also a couple of comments on TSE and Waste. I informed them, and they agree, that we will have plenty to discuss at our Data Response Workshop. Many of the staff will also be at the Informational Hearing on the 30th.

What it comes down to is this - I have no idea what was discussed at the pre-filing meeting and any other meeting staff had with the applicant and/or BAAQMD prior to the project being filed (other than what was just explained to me). It was decided from this conference call that we'd file our data requests, and they would respond to them how they see fit and then we'll hash out any disagreements at the Data Response workshop sometime in September.
